The HR Committee and the staff of UPC wanted to reassure you that all phases of our church life will continue through our transition period following the departure of Stephen. We will certainly notice his absence, but nothing will be curtailed, delayed, or ignored during this time. The staff is secure in their job responsibilities and comfortable with additional tasks they've been asked to do. Definitive lists have been made and understood. Our auxiliary staff has agreed to step up and serve when needed. Our church leaders and volunteers will anchor and lead as needed. Whether it is a question, problem, prayer, birth, death, wedding, funeral, property, etc, we are prepared to respond to your needs. Faces may change, but procedures remain the same.

While the Interim Pastor Search Committee is working diligently, there may be a time gap between the departure of Stephen and the hiring of an interim pastor. If this were to happen, HR would appoint a Coordinating Elder who will serve as the Acting Head of Staff. Again, we would remain at full service.

The purpose of the Interim Pastor is to prepare UPC for the next step of extending a call to a permanent pastor. In order to do this, we will go through a study of who and what we are, our goals and expectations, our hopes and plans for the future. Their goal is not to grow or change the church, but help us explore where we are, where we are going, and how we will get there.

While this is a time of anticipation and, perhaps, uncertainty, your church will be here to continue to serve you and the Lord.

### **Refugee Sunday at UPC-July 9th**

On Sunday, July 9<sup>th</sup> we will have a special service at UPC. The Good Neighbor Team will be working with me to design a worship service centering around themes of justice and the refugee crisis. All over the country and world people will be celebrating Refugee Sunday this summer. Through our worship on Refugee Sunday we aspire to demonstrate welcome through our actions to refugees and asylum seekers, learn more about refugees and asylum seekers, witness the recent and faithful work of the Good Neighbor Team at UPC, engage in practical action to take an active stance to promote more generous and welcoming refugee policies, and pray, sing, and hope for the end of the conflicts around the world. Following the service, there will be tables set up in the Fellowship Hall for individuals to find a way in which they can tangibly serve refugee populations based on your interests and strengths.

Leading up to Sunday, July 9th use the hash tags <u>#wechoosewelcome</u> and <u>#upc4refugees</u> on Facebook and tag Scripture, images, or videos that remind you of the Christian values of welcome, hospitality, and love for the stranger. We will be displaying these images during the service.

### **Community Choir**

The Community Choir is back! This group is designed for anyone who likes to sing. You do not have to be trained, you do not need to read music, and you don't have to have any choir experience! The goal is to meet the singers in the Chancel Choir, have fun singing, and offer music to God and the community in worship. If you have wanted to sing with a group, or have sung with a group but can't commit to weekly rehearsal, this opportunity is for you.

On the third Sunday of the summer months (June, July, and August) we will have a rehearsal in the sanctuary at 9:00am to learn the music. Then, the Community Choir will sing for the prelude and then head back to their seats so everyone can be in the pews for the rest of the service.

The Community Choir will sing two more times this summer. On July 16<sup>th</sup>, the Community Choir will be singing at Independence Village. But often times they do not get to hear choir music at Independence Village. In preparation for this service, we will meet at United Presbyterian Church at 9:00am to learn the music. At 9:45am, we will car-pool over to Independence Village and worship with the residents there.

### **Breathe Easy This Summer**

Pollution, pollen, and humidity can make summer precarious for people with asthma. Asthma, a chronic lung disease that inflames and narrows airways, can cause shortness of breath, coughing and other symptoms. In summertime, triggers for asthma attacks abound. To prevent flare-ups:

• Pay attention to pollen counts. Exposure to pollen can make asthma worse, so people with asthma should stay indoors when counts are high. Many asthma sufferers benefit from taking an over the counter daily anti-histamine when pollen counts go up.

- Avoid exposure to air pollution. Limit time outdoors when air quality forecasts indicate levels are high. Close windows, and keep air conditioning on.
- **Reduce indoor humidity**. Keep an eye on the air quality within in your home. Warm summer breezes do feel great but sometimes running the air conditioner is the best solution for people with asthma.
- **Be aware of chemicals**. Be aware of lurking chemicals that might cause an attack, such as chlorine in swimming pools or cleaning products.
- Take medication as prescribed. Taking medication as prescribed by your physician is an easy way to prevent and treat symptoms. Make sure you understand what the medication is used for and whether it is a daily preventative or a rescue medication.

### Get in on the Action

Would you like to be part of ministry that makes a real difference in others' lives when they need it most—and in you own? Consider becoming a Stephen Minister

Stephen Ministers are members of our congregation who provide one-to-one caring ministry to people experience grief, divorce, loneliness, job loss, hospitalization and many other life difficulties.

Stephen Minister training equips you to do an excellent job as a Stephen Minister as well as to improve the quality of all your relationships. Topics include listening, feeling, confidentiality, providing Christian care, maintaining boundaries, crisis theory and practice, and many more.

Once equipped Stephen Ministers are prayerfully matched with people who are going through a stressful time or life difficulty. A Stephen Minister meets with this person once a week for about an hour to listen, care, encourage, and pray. The Stephen Minister brings Christ's presence into the person's life and also experiences Christ in the other person. It is really a life changing ministry for both the care receiver and the Stephen Minister.

United Presbyterian would like to expand our Stephen Minister program by training more Stephen Ministers. Won't you prayerfully consider signing up for the training class to begin this fall.
